


Dressing up is purely voluntary for those who would like to get involved and have some fun.

ESSPA committee and volunteers will also be selling popcorn – preordered through the forms from ESSPA




<u>Learning at JIS – from Cath Wan, Deputy Principal/ PYP Coordinator</u>
<u>Action in the PYP</u>



In my last Learning at JIS article, I talked about how we are developing student 'agency' through our annual show production. This week, I will talk about an essential element of the PYP, action.

Action is closely connected to agency; a student who is empowered through voice, choice and ownership of their learning, is more likely to take self-initiated action. Action is also linked to the learner profile, as these habits of mind naturally produce independent, caring, self-motivated learners and to international-mindedness as students realise that, as an empowered world-citizen, they can make a change.



Taking action, does not have to be about saving the rainforests, or eradicating world poverty. Action, can be as small as a change in attitude. It is an example of where a student has taken what they have learned and made it their own. It could be as simple as becoming responsible for cleaning their own teeth after learning about self-care; deciding to use conflict resolution skills taught in school when arguing with a sibling at home; deciding to help with recycling after learning about the effects of plastic in the ocean. And of course, if students decide to take steps to save the rainforests or eradicate world poverty that's fine too! The latest documentation on action from the IB, sorts action into 5 categories:

- Life-style choices
- Participation
- Advocacy
- Social Justice
- Social entrepreneurship

#### **Action investigation**

Parents, we'd like to ask for your help. As part of our 'I.B. self – study' and in order for us, as a school, to reflect critically on how we enable empowered action- taking students, we'd like to collect examples of action that you observe with your child at home.

On the document below, you will find chart with the 5 categories of action, alongside examples, in the left hand column. In the right hand-column, we would like all the JIS community to add examples of action that

they have observed. Just a quick sentence is fine. The boxes expand infinitely, so please do not be shy about celebrating your child's action!
