Rohingya refugee clothing appeal Nov 2017:



On Wednesday morning we loaded up a truck to send all of your kind donations of clothes on their way to support the refugees on the borders of Bangladesh and Myanmar. Many thanks again to all who supported this quick appeal.

Visits in and out this week:

• P5 and P6 had a hike off to Tai Po Kau country park as part of the launch for their new unit of inquiry – 'The design of buildings and structures is dependent upon environmental factors, human ingenuity and available materials'. The students used natural materials to create structures using scientifically based concepts. There was a lot of creativity and commitment on show! They learned a lot about strength of materials and made some excellent connections with their previous learning.





• P2 and P3 classes had exchange activities with Japanese Section. P2 students played some traditional Japanese games, organised by the JS students. There were lots of different centres for our students to visit and have a go at. In P3 the students also did some games, designed by some of the JS students but the activities were more arts and crafts based with some traditional Japanese activities to learn and experience.









Although the curriculum of the two schools is very different – there are still some positive exchange activities that can be planned for the students of both sections. Our thanks to the staff and students of Japanese Section for hosting our classes.

Sports Day – 8th December - BIG Reminder:

JIS Sports day will be on Friday 8th December, from 1:15pm at the HKEDU sports stadium close to JIS. The whole school will be involved and will go by bus to the stadium around 1pm. Events will be scheduled from 1:30 – 3:30pm at the stadium. The stadium is located on Yau King Lane, just around the corner to JIS and does have car parking facilities.

 All students need to wear their new JIS 'house' tshirt or a t shirt of their own that matches their house colour. JIS green sports PE shorts and trainers may be worn with the colour t-shirts all day.



- Please make sure your child has a water bottle and snack and lunch as normal on this day. Students will
 eat their lunch at school before going off for sports events.
- All school buses will leave from the stadium around 3:30pm. Please make sure you have completed the relevant forms about how your child(ren) are getting home after Sports Day we need to be sure all students are safe and collected on time. If your child usually takes a school bus, but will not on this occasion, please contact your bus company. Do not take your child away from the stadium without making sure your child's class teacher is aware you are leaving. If your plans change on Friday afternoon (eg. bus to no bus etc.) please make sure the class teacher knows what is happening this is SO important in making sure we do not have unaccounted for students.

Italian lessons at JIS – January 2018

We have recently been negotiating with the Italian Embassy in Hong Kong about the prospect of organizing after school Italian lessons for JIS students – our Italian community is growing every year! The lessons will plan to start after the Christmas holidays on Tuesday 16th January, 2018. The embassy would like at least 4 students to start the class and will run a 10 week course in term 2 and future courses after this time, if there is enough interest.
