New school uniform: available August 2018

Our school uniform supplier ‘Brilliant Trend’ has recently decided to close their business and allow Maleerut and Steve to enjoy a happy retirement which has allowed us to enter into negotiations with a new uniform supplier for 2018-19 school year. After 20 years of service we thank Brilliant Trend for their support to the school.

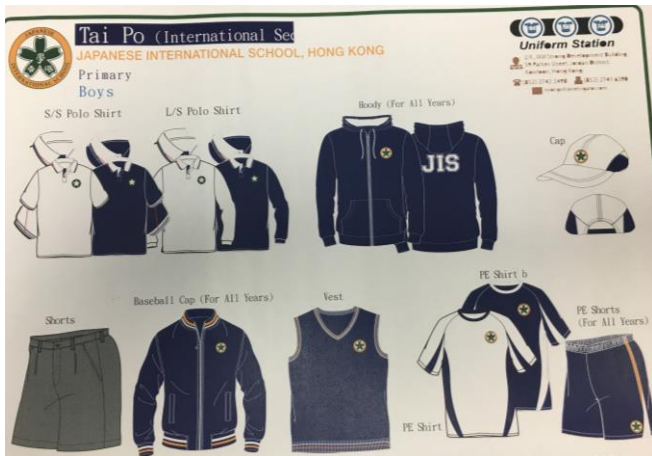
We have taken this opportunity to look at some improvements to the uniform whilst still retaining the JIS tradition of what the students have to wear. There will not be an instant change as we appreciate some students may still have ‘wear’ left in existing uniform items but we have a gradual phasing out of the old uniform during the next school year, 2018-19.

Our new uniform supplier: Uniform Station Ltd; is very experienced in supplying the uniforms for many schools around Hong Kong and have offered the types of improvements to the service we would like to implement. There will still be a shop at school, a main depot style shop in Kowloon / Jordan area and an on-line ordering service for home delivery.

A key development has to be the use of better quality fabrics as well as aspects of design – see photos below. We wanted to make the school uniform more stylish and reflect the needs and comments of some of our community. The company will also guarantee items and offer a tailoring or adjustment service.

We will be moving away from the green domination of colour and move into a more stylish and classy navy blue and grey – which is the current colour scheme of our sister school in Happy Valley. It was hoped to unite all of our schools into a common identity of colour and style but Japanese Section (Tai Po) has recently decided to keep all aspects of their uniform the same.

There will be an option for dark blue shirts for those long suffering parents of the ‘white shirt’ dirt phenomenon – as requested, but we will still use the white versions for official photographs and as our main school uniform.



Items for winter or cooler weather will be made in the first term once agreed designs are created. We have left a rail of the sample items in the school lobby area for students and parents to see. We hope it will be more representative of our school to have a bit more style and panache!
