### P6 visit to Xian, China

Last week the P6 students did an amazing job on their trip to Xi'an. Ms. P., Laoshi (Judith Tseng) and Mr Walton accompanied the students, with the support of 2 travel guides in China – Cathy and Maggie. The weather was chilly and a bit wet at the start of the week but by moving the schedules around the students were able to really make the most of their opportunities and enjoy the sunshine on Thursday and Friday. The days were full, with action from 8a.m. breakfast to cultural dance shows finishing at 9pm on one day lots of museums, temples, kung fu demos, taichi, shadow puppetry and of course warriors to see on all the other days.

#### **Around school:**

Some really enjoyable activities and learning experiences this week going on.

The P2 class was out and about in Tai Po Kau forest on Tuesday morning. A really fabulous experience of being outdoors, in the natural environment and exploring some really deep learning opportunities. The more we take the students out of school and into the diverse natural environments we feek empowered to continue. Ms Wan was totally buzzing about the science conversations she had had with some of the P2 students as they explored floating and sinking in the stream, whilst other groups were exploring scientific friction and angles in maths on the climbing apparatus. Follow that with some open ended creative activities and it's an excellent trip!

**The P6 class** went out on a big connection and transdisciplinary visit to the HK Museum of History on Wednesday. Taking all their observations, memories and learning from Xi'an Ms P. tasked the class with exploring the history of HK and its region. What are the historical connections and parallels? The students did a great job and were inspired even further in their inquiries.

**The P1 class** has further explored their unit of inquiry related to plants, growth and how they help sustain life with a visit to Green Produce Foundation in Fanling. Here the P1 harvested vegetables, made healthy pizza, picked rosella berries from their bushes and then made some berry jam with their harvest. The students followed the cycle of harvesting into food production on a first hand level. The best way to learn anything!
