# Head Lice update – community awareness update

Head Lice are a common problem in school aged children. They can't be prevented, but regular checking ensures early detection and treatment if necessary. Parents and carers should check their children's head once a week during hair washing. You need your usual shampoo, conditioner, and a detection comb – ask your local pharmacist to recommend a suitable one. Remember that you are looking for living moving lice,

the only evidence that your child is infected. If you find a living louse, ask your local pharmacist, school nurse, health visitor or GP for advice regarding treatment.

Please make sure to treat your child's hair before returning them to school. It may be necessary to treat the whole family and change pillow bedding etc. After the initial treatment it should be repeated between 7-9 days later. Please follow up with all treatments to ensure eradication of the head lice.
