### Flu vaccines: more information regarding suppliers and vaccine type.

On behalf of a JIS parent Ms Christine Lau, our first aid coordinator has contacted the HK authorities regarding the influenza vaccines used for the student health service free of charge offer. A summary of the reply she received is below:

Dear parents,

I would like to clarify some points on the 2019/20 Seasonal Influenza Vaccination School Outreach programme by the Health Department.

- 1. It will be using Quadrivalent influenza vaccines.
- 2. All vaccines used will be the same as the Health Department.
- 3. The supplier will be Sanofi.
- 4. Chung Hong Medical Center will be the private partnership with the Health Department to provide the vaccination services to our school.

Again this is a free of charge programme to join on family preference —by invitation. Please feel free to contact me if needed.

# Employment Opportunity for part time Educational Assistant at JIS – staring mid-November (if possible)

We invite applications from the JIS community and beyond for a 3 day per week Educational Assistant position in our P5 class, starting in mid-November 2019 (if possible). Ms Shabnam Diwan has been studying hard and gaining experience in the support of students with specific learning needs and she has now been offered a full time teaching position in a HK Student Support clinic. We are delighted that all her hard work and research has shown a positive reward.

The position of Education Assistant would be 'term time' only (no holiday commitments) for 3 days (17.5 hours) per week supporting the learning of our P5 class. The role includes supporting the students in group work or individual activities, admin support for the class and supervision support. The main focus of the role is to support students learning and enhance the learning opportunities for the P5 class. The role is paid on an hourly rate of HK\$180 and accumulates a salary of around \$12,000, depending on days worked.
