# Around school:

### **Dress Casual Day - today**

Many thanks to everyone who has supported the HK Community Chest today with their participation in Dress Casual Day. The donations are spread around a wide range of HK based charities who do some excellent work in supporting families and children less fortunate than ourselves. Today we have raised: \$3,090 – thank you so much for the support!

### HK Government Student Grant forms - sent out from the school office

Copies of the Student Grant claim forms for 2020-21 have been sent out from the school office. Please thoroughly check all details to complete your form as accurately as possible. The checking of the previous forms by HK Govt departments was done in great detail and many were returned for editing. Families who have put in a claim previously have generally received a green form and new claims are to be on a white form.

All forms need to be returned to school by Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> October in order for us to officially chop them and submit them to the HK Govt departments.

### JIS – COVID 19 updates and JIS school day

Further to our update last week I can confirm that the school has submitted a revised 'school resumption' plan for consideration by HK EDB. The plan involves getting all students back to school for either a full day (8:15 a.m. -2:45 p.m. - lunch at school) which is our preferred model or for an extended morning (8:15 a.m. -1pm) with no lunch eaten on campus. We have outlined the purchase of Perspex screening and full cleaning arrangements for both plans to comply with regulations and look forward to a response to the ideas as soon as possible. We have asked for the changes to begin from November 2020, if possible. As soon as I have news I will share it with the JIS community.

# Parent Teacher interviews – November 10th and 12th

In line with our normal assessment procedures all parents will receive an invitation to book an appointment for a meeting with their child's class teacher on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> November or Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> November, between 3:30pm and 6 p.m. The invitation email gives you access to a short questionnaire booking system to allow us to plan the evenings ahead more easily. The appointments will be 10 minutes long and will be online (Google Meets video conference) to facilitate ease of joining and also safe hygiene practices within the school building. We are sending the details out early to make sure that appointments can be made to fit in with schedules for everyone.

# **Outdoor learning update from Fiona Merrill**

Last year JIS invested in some large, outdoor loose parts play equipment that have been set up in the adventure playground area; boxes, planks, tires, bamboo structures and ladders are some of the materials the children are enjoying exploring.

Loose parts are open-ended play materials that can be used in a number of ways, encouraging children to experiment, work together, test theories and problem solve. There are endless possibilities and decision making opportunities for children as they engage in this kind of play and we are seeing the benefits for children on a daily basis.

There is a growing body of scientific evidence and research that shows that "children need 'managed' opportunities to explore and engage in risky play as this will enable them to manage future risks independently and to develop an understanding of safety." Exposing children to a range of opportunities to engage in risky play in the outdoors promotes their ability to assess risk and learn how to self-regulate.' (Hanrahan, 2018).

All classes have an opportunity to play with this new play equipment on a scheduled day and older children and younger children are benefitting from playing and working together. As a school we have created Essential Agreements to help us use the equipment safely and responsibly, the children have been asking the questions whilst at play 'Is this safe, how can I make this safe?'



(Note: All students are required to fully sanitise their hands before using the equipment and at the end of each recess there is a full cleaning routine)

**On November 5th JIS** will be participating in Outdoor Classroom Day. Throughout this week classes will be taking even more curriculum outside and finding ways to utilise our outdoor environment as much as possible in new ways.

Outdoor learning can enhance cognitive ability and focus, increase cooperation and motivation and develop self esteem. Our forest learning curriculum will hopefully be able to further develop this year, once conditions allow us to take students out more. We clearly saw its benefits for students in previous experiences and hope to integrate it more into our curriculum in the future.

Hong Kong is a wonderful place for children to explore. We have beautiful natural environments right on our doorstep! Get out and explore somewhere in nature this weekend!
