School day time changes:


World Book Day and JIS Book Week Challenges:

The appeal has been open for this week and thank you for the donations we have received. We shall now close the appeal on Monday morning -1^{st} March and make deliveries of the food donated to our chosen charities. The amount of food donations this year was really very positive – thank you.

3 Way conferences Students, Parents, Teachers - March 2021 – (22nd – 26th March)

We are due to hold our annual 3 Way conferences (Student, Teacher, Parent) in March 2021 to allow all of us to share some ideas and information about student development over the last few months. This year we are going to move the date of these conferences to allow for more time with teachers and students to be together at school – this will allow for more assessments and observations to be carried out and make these meetings as useful as possible.

The meetings will now be held in the week of March $22^{nd} - 26^{th} 2021$ (not on 9^{th} and 11^{th} March). We shall set up the meetings by having class teachers and students at school, who will then log on to meet with parents at work or at home, through Google Meets. The meetings will be managed when the children are in school sessions, by releasing class teachers to work with parents and students. All parents will be sent an invitation to the meeting in the next week or so.

P4 student camp – April 23 – 25th

Sadly we have had to agree with the Dragonfly camp provider that we will have to cancel our P4 camp in April. There is no obvious way that we can plan ahead for this and be secure in knowing it can happen. As most of us would agree the one thing that many children could do with right now is a great school camp ! SO we are in the process of negotiating with Dragonfly for some day camp activities for the P4 students – no overnight camping but still some kayaking and exploring in the Sai Kung country park. We shall share full information with the P4 class community as things are agreed.

We still hold a reservation for P5 in May and P6 in June with other camp providers and we hope that in some way we can be able to create an experience for the students!

Friday Assembly and Challenge – last week and also 26th February 2021



As the weather is getting warmer and the sun is getting more intense we shall be asking all students to wear a hat outdoors for morning recess. We shall therefore insist that the students wear a hat when they are on outside play sessions or outdoor P.E. lessons. ICHK Language presentation next Tuesday 2nd March at 9 .m.

A highly informative parent information session on languages at ICHK Secondary will be held next week.

On Tuesday (March 2), ICHK Secondary's Head of Languages Nicolas Arriaga will run a presentation entitled 'How languages are learned.'

Nicolas is a hugely experienced linguist, who has a broad experience as a lecturer, consultant, examiner, teacher-trainer and IB Global Action Team leader.

He will explain how languages are taught at ICHK, and explore with parents how languages are learned, the differences in first and second, foreign and additional languages, the benefits of language learning and why education systems around the world include an additional language in their curricula.

He will also speak about how language teaching and learning at ICHK Secondary connects with the 5+1 pastoral model, the best methods to teach languages and the preferred age to learn.

The talk will begin at 9am, and is open to all parents. It will be especially valuable to parents looking ahead to secondary school, wanting to find out more about the languages programme and ask questions about the different options.

Vaccinations update: HPV (P5 and P6 girls) and MMR (P1 and P6) Hepatitis (P6)

On Monday 8th March there will be vaccinations for P6 and P5 girls and the P1 students. All details have been sent home already but if you would like your child to be involved please send in the forms and documents to Ms. Miyajima as soon as possible. These vaccinations are managed through the HK Govt Health Department and are open to all students who are HK residents. Students in P5 and P1 who will need to come to school for their injection are asked to come between10:30 a.m. and 12p.m., once the records have been checked in the morning by Health Department staff.

We apologise that the P5 and P1 students cannot come in to school on this day as it would push us beyond our allowance of students in the school under the current guidelines from HK EDB. Crazy but true!
